WELCOME FROM DAVE, CHURCH ELDER

We will soon be half way through the year, yet

we have seen some big changes over the last six months that affects us in different ways. Ruth Cross our youth worker has left and moved to Market Harborough. Louise Corke vicar from St Phillip's and St James left after 14 years faithful service to take up a new post in the Diocese.

Louise was a big part of our church too, sharing many events and activities over the years. Our minister, Sue has taken retirement after a long illness. Although Sue was only with us for five years she made a big impact upon our Church life and she and Lewis will be missed. Sue liked to use images in her sermons and one she referred to regularly was that of the mustard seed that can grow into a large tree, that symbolism of



growth in faith. She introduced us to the Fruitfulness on the Frontline course which helped us to be more confident in building relationships on our front lines, wherever that may be, sowing those mustard seeds of faith.

Sadly Owen Hedges passed away in the Pilgrim Homes at Easter, after a long decline in his health and quality of life. Owen and Margaret came to our church in 1965; they sowed many seeds in their time, were such an inspiration and encouragement to many people starting out on their Christian journey, and were instrumental in many people coming to join the church. Owen served as an elder in our church for 21 years. Nobody will ever forget his sense of fun and constant stream of jokes. I said earlier that "Sadly Owen passed away", but really he was ready to go and he new exactly where he was going. His faith was unshakeable and he new the truth in the promise that we read in John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

All of these people who have left us are on a new journey in their walk of 1

faith, have sowed many seeds in their time with us, but in many cases may never see the fruit of their labour. If you are like me, you are perhaps a bit of an impatient gardener wanting to see those plants you put in the garden start to grow and flourish. We are like that with our mustard seeds sown.

Owen would have seen many changes over the 50 plus years he was a member of our church, seeing many people come and go and many come to believe in the truths of the gospel. I am sure if you are like me you will be feeling a little apprehensive as to what the future holds for our church, but there are many exciting things happening and will continue. The Fresh Expression events that are being planned and other CTG events to mention a few. We just need to hold on to that trust and faith that Owen had. The prayer at the end is - 'Dear God, sometimes other people try to make us do the wrong thing. Please help us to be brave and stand up for what we know is right. Amen'


We pray that this is something that the children cannot just take into their summer break but into their lives, as particularly they go into their teenage years.

VOICE FOR

FLOODING IN CAJAMARCA



'We thank God that we're all fine though many families have lost everything'



says Miriam Moreno from Warmis.

During our Easter service, you may remember praying for the safety of those affected by the devastating floods in most of Peru, and particularly Cajamarca.

A sustained period of heavy rain had caused widespread flooding across Peru. Rivers burst their banks, bridges collapsed and there have been numerous mudslides. Almost all the country's regions were affected, and approximately 100,000 people had lost their homes, possessions and livelihoods.

In Cajamarca itself, ten villages and nearly 25,000 people have been affected by the flooding. Warmis has been working with the local authorities to assess the damage and see what aid needs to be provided. The photo on the right was taken in Cajamarca and shows what the locals were faced with.



Miriam has now sent us an update. "In six villages around Cajamarca City



we are looking to provide aid to 300 families. They include La Tulpana, Aylambo, Valle Verde, Sulluscocha, Paijan and Chetilla. Each village is a place that we have been working, or is a place we are aware has not received

support from any other agency. The regular support of people like you has helped us to respond to this crisis and provide for the people of Aylambo. Warmis is providing mattresses, blankets, cooking implements and clothes to affected families. We will also be supplying food and clean water to all those who need it. As well as meeting material needs, we'll be making provision for emotional and spiritual support as people come to terms with what has happened. Even during the toughest times, our faith can keep us at peace. The people of Aylambo have been showing great faith".

Pray for those who have lost everything in these floods, pray that God will comfort them and they will know his presence in this tragic time.

Please pray for all the rescue staff across Peru working to reach and help those who need it. Pray that God will give them strength to keep going and keep them safe. Pray for Miriam, Miguel and their family as they cope with this crisis.

Please pray that the climate will settle down, and people will be able to begin rebuilding their lives.
