

tearfund THANK GOD FOR 50 YEARS OF TEARFUND



In our service last autumn, we introduced Sylvia and Polly, 2 women in Malawi who were highlighted as part of Tearfund's 'Hunger Steals' campaign. At that time, Polly had been working with Tearfund's partner, AG Care and had been trained in a farming technique known as Foundations for Farming, which trains farmers to be able to successfully farm even in drought conditions. Sylvia, by contrast, was struggling to feed her family.

Sylvia has now also received training from AG Care and has cultivated 1.5 acres of maize and 1 acre of groundnuts. She has also started keeping chickens. "I thank AG Care for teaching me new farming skills and knowledge. My life has changed so much," says Sylvia. Her successful harvest and new skills will mean she is able to build a new, better home this year for her and her family.

Let us thank God for the amazing work that Tearfund and their partner AG Care are doing with farmers like Sylvia and Polly. All around the world, local churches are leading their communities out of lives devastated by hunger and into lives filled with dignity, opportunity and strength. Please continue to pray for this amazing work.

tearfund 50 YEARS OF TEARFUND

In the very first edition of the TEARTIMES you will find the following statement: We believe we have an added responsibility to arrest the attention of evangelicals in this country, and inform them of the needs, requirements and opportunities to help. Are we willing to continue to have compassion and try to bridge the huge gap by living simply, so that the others can simply live? The work is not completed, it needs to go on.
