Future dates: 16th February, 15th March and 19th April all starting at 4pm.



### AN AMAZING AMOUNT OF LOOS!!

What a wonderfully generous people you are! Your giving to the Christmas Toilet Twinning fund-raiser has provided enough cash for us to buy seven toilet blocks for schools in some of the poorest communities via Tearfund. The grand total of £1770.40, included a large donation from the toddler groups and other very generous individual donations. As well as the seven school toilet blocks, there is enough to buy a further single toilet and provide the project with a donation.



Alongside this – Jane Hinds has been busy at her hairdressing salon, 'Snips' with herself and customers raising funds in a pink potty (what else?!) for two new toilet's – in Kabindi (Democratic Republic of Congo) and Kagoro (Eastern Province of Zambia). At least 3 church families have also decided to twin their toilet this Christmas.

This is fantastic and will have a huge impact on the lives of children and young people in some of the poorest parts of the world. By providing safe, private and clean loos, more children and young people will be able to continue going to school without falling sick or feeling vulnerable to attack. Education is such an important factor in helping combat poverty.

All three primary schools have agreed to accept a gift of Toilet Twinning certificates from us, which we hope will be presented to the schools fairly soon along with information about the Tearfund run project, possibly within a school assembly. We're also looking to invite the library and the Stamford Arms to accept a certificate and will provide updates as this develops.

We have only been going to Ratby since September and already they look forward to our presentations each month. One of the teachers told me it is good for her to see what her daughter, who goes to a Groby school, has told her about so many times. The children just love it, and most importantly soak up the stories, God's Word presented as it is to them.

They are learning in January that – 'Isn't it exciting to know that each one of us matters to God in our own special way?'

In February the presentation is 'the Storm on the Lake' where in the prayer at the end is –

Dear God, when we are worried or afraid and there's no-one to talk to, help us to remember that you are with us and that we are never alone. Amen.'

Please pray for the Groby, and Ratby, children – that many will want to know much more about how special they are to God and how God is always there for them.

# Tearfund RECOGNITION BY ZIMBABWE GOVERNMENT FOR TEARFUND **PARTNERS**

Tearfund's partners in Zimbabwe 'Orphans Through Extended Hands' (ZOE) have been recognised for bravery by their government and have had the Humanitarian Award of Bravery medal awarded by the country's president Emmerson Mnangagwa. As with all the Tearfund staff and partners in Eastern Africa, when Cyclone Idai hit, they responded immediately to the devastation.

ZOE mobilised church members who were not affected, to give clothes and food to those that were left with nothing. They became a first point of call for other NGOs. And they are continuing to support people, through the initiation of things like



livelihoods projects to help people rebuild some of what they lost.

Receiving the award, Pastor Femai from ZOE said' Being compassionate calls for you to take practical action with the few resources you have, even if it means sacrificing your life for others, to prove how Jesus would respond in the situation'.

One church leader characterised the church as a tree called 'Musambangwena'. It is a type of tree grows by the river. Even if a heavy flood comes it will always stand, even in difficult times. It is a sign of hope and is resilient.

Please pray for ZOE as they continue their work in an extremely difficult situation, where there are acute food shortages.

Pray for more opportunities with training centres, who ZOE are linking young people with so they can learn new skills that equip them for the future.

Pray that ZOE will be able to access solar energy to alleviate the current power challenges they face - enabling them to move forward in their daily activities. - Kathy Du Boulay


