

(Isaiah 6:1) Few people could remember a life without Uzziah on the throne – he had reigned 52 years, presiding over an era of prosperity, innovation and peace. His death had shaken the nation. And yet it was then that Isaiah received his commission.


Times of shaking have always been moments of extraordinary opportunity.'

A is for Activist

We can all be activists in many different ways, but whatever we do we do it to partner God in seeing His justice extend into our world

No excuses allowed for knowing of someone's distress and doing nothing about it. We should be activists because of the state of our world and our hope for the future



Action Points

Choose one thing that will build up your knowledge and understanding of some of the world's environmental problems. For example, commit to regularly watching some of the prolific TV documentaries and news programmes.

As you do so, ask God to give you vision and fill you with compassion.

B is for Banana

Are you one of the 90% of households in the UK who buy bananas? Despite the welcome growth of fairly traded banana sales in the UK, the overwhelming majority of consumption globally is produced in poor conditions, with low pay for the growers, unsuitable housing and poor protection from the use of pesticides. The toxins cause sterility in men and brain damage in children.



What can we do?

Buy fairly traded bananas!

Question: If when doing your weekly supermarket shop they don't stock fairly traded bananas, do you go somewhere else to buy them?

Corporate power is very concentrated with the multinational companies - Chiquita, Dole, Del Monte, Fyffes, Noboa and the Supermarkets controlling production by trying to keep prices artificially low in order to attract shoppers.

Our breakfast bananas are a complex game in global trade.

After a break in July while many families were away Y-Church & Ready, Set, Go returned in August and September. The children were really happy to be back & to see each other again, we've had some great sessions with them & as usual they've come up with some fantastic work & some really challenging questions for the leaders!

Below are just a couple of highlights.

In August Y-Church spent a session thinking about praising God & talking about Psalms, at the end of the session the kids wrote their own Psalm – here it is:

Thank you for my family, food and water.

I praise God for people and the bible.

I worship God for home, sleep and holidays

We worship you our Lord and Saviour for giving us shelter and friends.

If we praise our Lord then our space in heaven will await us. All of the world will unite and the Holy Spirit will surround us.

At the beginning of September our Ready, Set, Go service was all about the Lord's Prayer & thinking about how we can pray. Again, the children used their creative skills to write their own versions of the Lord's Prayer:

The Servant Queen and the King She Serves.

In 2016 the Queen celebrated her 90th birthday, and to mark the occasion the Bible Society in partnership with HOPE and LICC published **The Servant Queen and the King She Serves**, which took a closer look at the Queen's personal faith in Jesus and the impact this had on her long life of service to the nation.



The foreword was written by the Queen herself, where she says:

"I have been – and remain – very grateful to you for your prayers and to God for his steadfast love. I have indeed seen his faithfulness."

Calling all singers everywhere - After a long 2 years when we couldn't meet to sing in person, Groby Sings resumed sessions at The Groby Club in the spring and early summer this year, culminating in a wonderful singing party where singers past and present got together to sing a selection of songs celebrating this much-loved community choir being *On The Road Again*. Now we are ready to grow our numbers from the 100+ who came back this spring to the well-over 250 singers who enjoyed the music, the socialising and, of course, a cuppa and a cake before we were all blighted by Covid.

Anyone and everyone who loves to sing is invited to come along on **Wednesdays** during school term. This autumn's theme is *Groby Sings Through the Seasons* ('from tulip time to winter snows' – guess the songs!). Pre-pandemic and twice a year since it was formed in 2013, Groby Sings has entertained audiences from far and wide with a variety of music from the shows and films together with classic favourites from all eras and we're really hoping to finish at the end of November 2022 with another concert.

Groby Sings is a registered charity (no. 1180490) and is a fully-inclusive choir. Our members come from all parts of Leicestershire, not just Groby, and everyone, young and not so young, is welcome however they enjoy singing. Experience varies from crooning in the shower, accompanying the karaoke machine, singing with children

and grandchildren or even more formal choral singing. There is a place for everyone and there are no auditions or a requirement to attend every week, though once you start you won't want to miss a single Wednesday! Performing in a concert is entirely voluntary and singers who choose not to be on stage will be very welcome in the audience. There is no fee to attend but as it costs approximately £2 per adult and £1.50 per young singer per session, members who are able to contribute something can do so by voluntary donation at the door or by a lump sum on which the charity may be able to claim Gift Aid, increasing donations by up to 25%.

Where and When?

*At **The Groby Club**, Leicester Road, Groby, Leicester LE6 0DJ (ramps and disabled facilities available)

*Wednesdays, term time only, beginning 7th September 2022 until the end of November. There is a choice of sessions for adult singers: 1.30pm – 3.00pm (pre-school children welcome in the care of their adult with a crèche area available) or 7.30pm – 9.00pm. The Youth and Children's Choir (7 years and over) is from 3.40-4.40pm. There is a 'cake break' in each session for a drink, a chat and cake!
