Welcome to the May edition of Contact

This year in May we will benefit from 3 Bank Holidays!

The Coronation of King Charles III will take place on Saturday 6 May 2023 at Westminster Abbey, in a service steeped in centuries of tradition and rich in Christian symbols and values. One suggested prayer of the Church of England is

Gracious God,

in company with our King,

we rededicate ourselves to your service.

Take our minds and think through them,

take our lips and speak through them,

take our hearts and set them on fire

with love for you and your kingdom;

that here we may have your peace,

and in the world to come may see you face to face;

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

As part of his letter to all clergy, Justin Welby - Archbishop of Canterbury writes:

"However you choose to mark the Coronation weekend, we hope this will be a time celebrating God's love and generosity, and making that love known in our communities and national life."

In the New Testament, Jesus is also described as a king, the true king of Israel and indeed of the whole world. Even Pontius Pilate, who signs Jesus' death warrant, writes on it "the King of the Jews" [John19:3]. But his model of kingship is very different to that of those Old Testament rulers, and indeed many rulers today. His kingship is not about power or prestige, wealth or status. Most people who came across him in the 1st Century would not have thought he was a king of any kind, and when he was sentenced to death and crucified then faith in Jesus as God's chosen king would have been very difficult to sustain. But the consistent witness of those who were there and wrote about these things is that Jesus rose from death after three days, and that one day he will return to this world. At that point heaven and earth will be renewed and reconciled, and Jesus will reign, the King of justice and of peace. [from Christianity.org.uk]

We are here to offer advice and support to the Elders and Group Leaders when making decisions around safeguarding policy and implementing the guidelines set by the URC. If you have any safeguarding concerns we are more than happy to listen and offer advice on what to do next.

So what does Safeguarding mean?!

To us, it means making sure that we are providing a safe, welcoming environment for our church family and for the wider community who enter our Church. We do this through having risk assessments, policies and procedures in place to ensure we are able to provide that safe, welcoming environment and by attending training to ensure we keep our awareness of the signs and symptoms of abuse up to date. Safeguarding is about protecting ourselves with safe practices as well as noticing any safeguarding concerns in those we come into contact with.

Please complete the job application forms for volunteer roles as part of our safer recruitment processes.

If you have any concerns at all about anyone or anything, please talk to us. No concern is too small.



Christian Aid Week 2023 is focused on how farmers in Malawi are transforming their livelihoods using the humble but mighty pigeon pea - a drought resistant, soil revitalising, high-protein delicious crop. Money raised can help to extend this work to other farmers, generating more income to support their families and afford school fees which have doubled in price in the last year.



What our gifts can do:

£10 Could pay for a 2kg bag of pigeon pea seeds.

£50 could provide pigeon pea seeds and farming tools for a family.

£70 could buy a bicycle so an experienced farmer can reach others in remote areas and teach them essential business skills.

£250 could pay for a cooperative oven, supporting more than 800 people to turn their pigeon peas into profit by baking bread. £1,000 could pay for a fish food processor, so co-operatives can turn their pigeon peas into fish food and raise fish to sell.

Finally and most importantly please support Christian Aid Week in prayer, and come to the CTG Christian Aid service which is at St Philip and St James on Sunday 14th May, 9.30am with Rev Ed and Rev Paul.

The Public Access Defibrillator on the Wall of our Church

As you can see, and probably will have already seen on our wall, the public access defibrillator is now installed and also registered, with public access 24 / 7.

It was an initiative by the Groby Allotment Society who approached us (Groby URC) to see if it were possible to install it on the wall of our building and close to the footpath that runs through the allotments.

The equipment was purchased with the help of a grant from the Thomas Herbert Smith's Trust Fund. The external cabinet will keep the defibrillator safe and warm via a small electrical charge, was donated by the Joe Humphries Memorial Trust. Training on its use was provided for allotment users and some of our own members included first aid response to cardiac arrest.

If you missed this, the important thing to remember is that it can be accessed by dialling 999, and the equipment does have audio instructions on it's use.





We had great fun with our Easter presentation, bringing back our lovely donkey who responds particularly well to a carrot! The children loved him and thoroughly enjoyed following Jesus, waving their palms and shouting and cheering. It was a very noisy presentation indeed.

We have begun our new term back in the Old Testament with a large cast of children and noise once again, when Joshua blows his trumpet and the walls fall down. We have children dressed in tabards representing the walls and more children in tunics as Joshua's army. The rest of the children enjoy counting the 7 trips round the walls on the 7th day before Joshua lets rip with his trumpet.

Its all great fun, as anyone in the team will tell you. We are always keen to have new members join us, so if you feel this could be for you, just have a chat to any of us about it. We do also very much appreciate your prayers for the team, the children, and the school staff who also, of course, hear our messages.


