WELCOME FROM MARY CHURCH ELDER.

You sometimes hear people say 'it takes a village to raise a child', not meaning the location or size of a place, but the local community who provide education, example, care and inspiration.



This was certainly true for my children as they were growing up, both here in Groby and in Luton. I think back with thanks to the many people who played a part in their development. Play group teachers, Brownie, Guide and Cub leaders, Y Church leaders and the amazing teams that took them off to Bonsall or Bala every year, to name just a few.

In my experience it seems to be a similar process for raising a Christian, many people play a part, whether it's at the beginning, witnessing to the 'not yet believer' or later in the journey when encouragement and discipleship are needed.

In Hebrews 12.1 the writer talks about the 'great cloud of witnesses' who have gone before us and been faithful. I think back gratefully to those who witnessed to me when I was an extremely sceptical non believer. For the most part they will have no idea that their words made any difference. For example the teacher who invited our whole class of 18 year olds to his Church. We went along out of curiosity, but there was no instant conversion or even enough interest for a second visit. He would never have known that this experience was an important stepping stone on my journey to faith. Likewise the lady who I met at some random meeting in 1980. I have no recollection of what the meeting was about, but she recruited me as a Christian Aid collector!

I wasn't a Christian, or even a Church goer, virtually a stranger but she took a chance and asked me to help. Another step on my way to faith.

I thank God for these people, and others, for their faithfulness and gentle witness. Thinking about them makes me reflect on the many ways we can be witnesses and that we should not be discouraged if we don't see immediate results. We may plant a seed that takes time to grow and flourish, and it may be other Christians who are there to nurture and sustain. Everything is in God's hands and his timing applies.

I'm sure we will all remember certain individuals who have helped us on our Christian journey. Let us take time to thank God for them and to ask for His grace, that by the power of His Holy Spirit, we too step up and play our part in the 'great cloud of witnesses'. Pray that He will use us to encourage others and that we are open to the opportunities that He gives us to be witnesses. Let us sow the seeds and have faith that there will be a harvest.

In the coming weeks opportunities to witness include Tasters and Alpha to name just two. It would also be a great encouragement to everyone to see a good turn out at our Church meeting on 28th September when we have so much to discuss about our Church life

'Let us run with determination the race that lies before us. Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from beginning to end. 'Hebrews 12. 1-2.

It's not just their names that have changed, the couple have found new purpose in life. They now have a

pineapple farm and are currently making bricks to build their own house. They believe that **Tearfund's** vision for local churches (CCT) could spread across the country and totally transform Ivory Coast.

Being fruitful: 'I was serving God but I didn't know I belonged to God. I thought if I gave myself to Him, I should also be responsible for taking care of his creation.' **Marc from Ivory Coast** didn't want to just alter his behaviour, actions and activities, he was so inspired by the CCT* Bible studies, about caring for God's creation he wanted to change his name. 'I am now **Adam** and realise God has given me all of creation, so, like Adam and Eve, we are responsible for taking care of everything around us.'

The Bible studies also inspired Marc's wife **Eudoxie**, who chose to change her name too. 'I am happy to be called **Eve** because I'm created by God,' she says. Thank you for your prayer and support.

In the last few months we have been able to suggest actions we could take to make our world a better place, and we hope you have found these ideas useful and practical.



Reading through the chapter on 'Investments' however, it became clear to us that assets and investments are private and personal and not the easiest subject to understand or talk about.

JUSTICE

Having said that, we believe as Christians our assets need to be part of our worship to God.

Recently, at morning worship we sang a golden oldie hymn written by Francis Havergal:

> Take my silver and my gold, Not a mite would I withhold. Take my intellect and use Every pow'r as Thou shalt choose.

In other words, each of us needs to prayerfully work this process out with God, and by doing so, it could be a blessing for us and for mankind.

CHURCH GIVING

Paul recently preached a sermon on 'giving' and reported that personal church giving (not specifically given for maintenance or mission) has decreased year on year since 2019. He challenged each of us to examine our giving of money and time, before God, and to determine if it is appropriate compared to all the riches that God has provided for us.

I do know, as church treasurer, that some members/attenders are very generous in their personal giving, whilst others may not have increased their giving in a number of years. The church is very grateful to receive all donations large or small and we would like to thank all of you that give of your time and money to the effective running of the church and to the work of God. I am, however, also aware of the recent cost of living rises and how this impacts families, but we also need to recognise that church bills have also increased, especially utility bills.

Personal church giving can be by bank standing order, cash or cheque in envelopes or cash/cheque on an offertory plate. Gift aid can be claimed via tax payers who have authorised it on a form that I can provide. By far the easiest method to administer, for both the giver and the treasurer, is by bank standing order. 



At our recent Men's Breakfast we heard about the remarkable true story of William Coltman VC, one of the most highly decorated non-commissioned officers of the First World War. Living by the word of God, this humble man chose not to take up arms against other men, but to become a stretcher bearer. God presided over his fate each day and allowed him under the most extreme of conditions to save many lives at a time when the average life expectancy at the front during an attack was only 20-30 minutes. William repeatedly put himself in mortal danger and received amongst other awards, the Victoria Cross - "For Valour". In saving the lives of many men William would reflect the selfless devotion and sacrifice that led Christ to the Cross for us.

We would love to encourage as many people as possible to contribute to the prayer sheet, so if you have any topics you would like to get people praying for then please get in touch with Rachel Edwards to get them included in future sheets.

Praying for the Alpha Course

For the first time for quite a few years, the two Groby Churches are joining, this time together with the two Ratby Churches, in offering an *Alpha* course. This is being held in the URC on Monday evenings from 18th September.

Alpha is a long-established course that introduces the participants to the beliefs of the Christian faith. Each evening comprises a meal together, watching a DVD and then discussing that in small groups.

God has blessed it extensively in many countries of the World to bring innumerable people to know Christ.

Please pray:

- For all the guests who are attending our Alpha course, that every one will be open to listen to the views of others and recognise the truth of Christian claims.
- That every guest will be touched by God and draw closer to Him.
- For the Day Away on 4th November.
- For the group facilitators, for sensitivity to allow the discussions to flow and wisdom to know when to intervene.
- For the cooks from all four Churches who will make a major contribution by providing the dinners, at which relationships and friendships will be formed, facilitating later open discussions.
- For the four Churches and their clergy to continue to work together effectively for the Kingdom, to present a united Christian front in both villages.
- For the guests when the course has finished in late November, that they will find spiritual homes.

Prayers for Libya

As you will have heard the Derna area of Libya has been hit by a catastrophic flood, at the time of writing this a lot of details are still becoming clear, but it would appear that thousands of people have lost their lives and this number is expected to continue to rise with tens of thousands of people still missing.

As with all disasters of this nature it is easy to feel overwhelmed & left wondering what we can do to help, it is easy to forgot that prayer is the most powerful tool that we have:

Pray for the emergency response.

- Lift up first-responders and pray for energy and strength as they work around the clock to save lives.
- Pray for clear roads and bridges, so that emergency services and supplies can quickly reach those in need.
- Pray that those who are still missing will be found safe.
- Hospitals in the areas affected are overflowing. In Libya, many hospitals have not been rebuilt since they were destroyed in the conflict there. Pray for resilience for health workers as they respond; pray for capacity to treat people who are injured and for resources – medicine, equipment and hospital beds – to be readily available.

Pray for people affected by the earthquake.

 Pray for comfort for those who have lost their loved ones and healing for people who are injured. Ask God to draw near to them in this time of grief and uncertainty.

- Pray for provision of safe shelter, food and clean water and warmth for people who have lost their belongings, homes and livelihoods. Ask God to give them courage and strength to face these new challenges.
- Pray that vulnerable people such as people with disabilities, orphans and pregnant and nursing mothers will be protected and that no one will have to suffer alone.
- Pray for freedom from anxiety and fear for people who are feeling distressed – particularly those already in fragile situations throughout the region.



Praying for the start of the new school term

- Please remember our children as they return to school after the long summer holidays, with new classes, teachers and possible new friendships.
- Pray for our teachers, that they will feel re-energised and ready to face a new term.
- As the new term begins in schools, so also will our toddler and youth groups re-start. Pray for success, good attendance with good volunteer support for Noah's Ark, CATCH and Rock Solid.
