## WELCOME FROM KATHY CHURCH ELDER

Welcome to this double issue of Contact.

As we head into December, our focus on preparations for Christmas become more urgent -

its taken me quite a while to bear in mind that Christmas is in fact, only 3 weeks after the beginning of December, rather than a vague 'towards the end of December'.

Christmas can be difficult and challenging. We can be more aware than usual of a bereavement, of loneliness, or a lack of something. It seems particularly hard on those who normally struggle with life for all sorts of reasons - Christmas can just be an added burden.

The Christian faith teaches that Christ came into this world for all of us, to reveal God to us, to dwell among us. God meets us in our need wherever and whoever we are. The Christian faith is the only religion that cancels our need to 'strive' to be worthy enough to reach a certain level of discipleship. "Nothing in earth or heaven can be more awesome, more unexpected than this: that Jesus, the 'Lord of Lords and King of Kings' (Rev. 17:14) descended the ladder to reveal God to us and to show us just how much God loves us". (Selwyn Hughes). Jesus came to enable us to have a relationship with God ".... we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:11). The word 'reconciliation' is 'made us God's friends' in some bible versions. How incredible is that! Why would God do that for us - you and I? Because of His unfathomable love for us. He shares our difficulties and challenges, our sorrows and our joys.

Rick Warren of 'Purpose Driven Life' fame - also wrote 'The Purpose of Christmas'. He explains that Christmas is a time for

Celebration - 'I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people' (Luke 2:10), Salvation i.e. to be saved from a life separated from God- 'He has saved us and called us to a holy life—not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace' (2 Tim. 1:9) and Reconciliation. Jesus came to make a relationship with God possible. 'All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation' (2 Corinthians 18)

Whatever sort of Christmas you have planned, I pray that you will feel God's presence throughout Advent and the Christmas season, and be blessed with the certain hope and assurance of God's love for you.

As we approach 2024, we have our Church AGM and annual elder's elections. Please take a look at Paul's piece on eldership (page 20) and consider what you can bring to the life of our church. It only took one boy to give what he had to Jesus and five thousand were fed with plenty left over. Jesus did the rest! (Mark 6:1-15)

I pray that the New Year will bring renewed vision and strength in Him to us all.

Gary Wood spoke to us on 5th November on the topic of prayer and fasting. He started his talk by recommending three books about prayer.


Power through prayer by E.M. Bounds. A slim volume, but a classic that Gary recommends as the best teaching book that he has read on prayer.

## Groby URC Prayer Sheet – Dec 2023/ Jan 2024


".The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." John 1:4

## WHAT THIS CHURCH NEEDS IS MORE OF 'THE ELDERLY'...

In the URC where I was a serving elder for 15 years, there was a Dutch lady, Minnie, who always referred to the elders collectively as 'The Elderly', to the amusement of myself and the other younger elders!

Each winter, Groby URC collectively considers who might be being called by God to serve as an elder here and that call is tested at the Annual Church Meeting in January.

So, please read on and seriously consider whether you are being called to serve as an elder, or if there is a Church member who you consider would fit the bill.

What are the functions of the elders? Overall, URC elders share together and with the minister both a spiritual leadership role and a pastoral role. Together, the main specific functions of the eldership are:

- To promote in the Church concern for witness and service to the community, evangelism at home and abroad, Christian education and ecumenical action;
- To ensure that public worship is offered regularly and to promote the welfare of the congregation (although we have a Preaching Secretary who books and contacts all visiting preachers on our behalf);
- To ensure pastoral care of the congregation (although not to do it all themselves!)
- To nominate one elder as Church Secretary;
- To keep the roll of members and lists of adherents and children, and to advise Church Meeting on the admission of new members and on the removal of members from the roll;
- To oversee our work with children and young people and all

our Church organisations;

To call for the election of elders:

To recommend to Church Meeting arrangements for proper maintenance of buildings and the general oversight of all the financial responsibilities of the local Church.

Ideally, I think, the eldership should roughly reflect the age profile of the local Church it serves. It is less healthy if all the elders are over retirement age. An elder must already be a member of Groby URC.

Please feel free to talk with me about eldership, with regard to yourself or another member.

Having said all that, eldership is nonetheless a calling from God. It is not a reward for long service in the Church. We read in Acts chapter 2 how the young Church appoints Matthias. They do this in the light of Scripture and in the context of prayer. Please will you prayerfully consider whom you believe God may be calling to serve Him as an elder of this Church at this time? The need for women and men of God to share in the leadership of this Church is clear; whom is He prompting?

## DID YOU KNOW THAT 1 IN 6 PEOPLE ARE SUFFERING WITH POOR MENTAL HEALTH AT ANY ONE TIME?

The day was most interesting and packed with useful and very practical suggestions on how to support someone suffering with their mental health.

Cheryl Hawkins, who led the course, spoke from her personal experiences and was passionate about using those experiences to help others with similar issues.

We look at what they are and how to manage and support them in the church.

These six 2-hour sessions are delivered on Zoom and we will have a choice of daytime or evening groups'.
