The 23rd Psalm, which is known and loved worldwide, has been depicted in a new work of art, now displayed in our church foyer.



There are many tasks that go into keeping our church running, some of these are very obvious, some less so. We have many rotas and an army of volunteers who complete all these tasks faithfully.

As a church we appreciate everyone of those who helps to fill a rota, and also those who work so hard to make sure that there are enough people to fill all the jobs that need to be done. Within this copy of Contact you will find a list of all those who are on a rota over the summer months.

Please take some time to look at these lists and thank God for those who give up their time to keep our church clean, maintained, provide a welcome on a Sunday morning and make sure there are refreshments after. Those who operate the media desk and provide the music so that services run smoothly. Please pray for those who put these rotas together, ask that God will encourage them and show that their commitment is valued by everyone. Prayerfully consider if God is calling you to add your name to a rota as a way of serving Him here in this church.

Summer Outreach Holiday Club

The main summer activity for children and young people is the holiday club planned for the 19th & 20th August. The sessions are being co-ordinated by Louise Brown, with support from both Groby URC and the parish churches in Groby and Ratby where the holiday club will be held.

Please pray for the following:

Before:

- o For the preparations going on in the build-up for the holiday club, ask God to ensure that there is enough helpers involved to make sure the sessions can go ahead.
- For Louise and her team as they put together the programme for the holiday club and source all the resources needed to make it happen.
- o For the publicity of the holiday club, that we will reach families who are not normally engaged in church activities and that they will be encouraged to come along and give it a go.

During:

- o For all those running each day, ask that God's spirit will be with them as they work with these children and that they will have the opportunity to share some of their faith.
- o For the children coming along, that they will encounter Jesus in what they see and do during the holiday club.

After:

That those who attended the holiday club days will continue to engage with other youth activities and will come to know Jesus.

Funtastic Fridays

As well as the holiday club, Louise is planning 'Funtastic Fridays', running most Friday mornings in August, in our Church (there is some info. on this on page 5).



- Pray for Louise and volunteers as they prepare to welcome families for each of these sessions.
- Pray that God will guide their preparations and choice of activities, and that families will be prompted to come along and get involved.
- Pray that the loving message of the Gospel will be evident, whether spoken or witnessed.

Sunday Special

We also have another Sunday Special planned on 25th August. This is for those who attend Tasters, specifically targeted at the adults who come along, who will be given invites to both the service and a bring and share lunch on this day.

- Pray for those who receive invites, that there will be a
 positive response and that they will want to come along, find out
 more about what we do on a Sunday and have some time of
 fellowship with us.
- Pray for those who attend the service, that they will encounter Jesus during this time and want to find out more!
- Pray for the Tasters volunteers that God will inspire and encourage them to be bold in sharing their faith with those who they speak to during Tasters.

Praying for our upcoming General Election

Reading Paul's welcome letter this month, we are encouraged to pray for the upcoming General Election, noting that Christians have an extra responsibility to pray for our leaders. He includes a prayer that we will find useful going forward to election date and beyond.

Karl Barth, a Swiss Reformed theologian, is reported to have once said, 'The clasping of the hands in prayer is the beginning of an uprising against the disorder of this world.'

Here are some suggestions taken from the 24-7 Prayer guide.

- Pray that the <u>process of voting</u> will be safe, fair and accessible to all, and that every vote will be counted and accurately reported.
- Pray for those voting, for wisdom and a sense of empowerment (particularly those voting for the first time)
- Pray for the media reporting on those wishing to be elected, that they will be accurate and truthful, and that they will promote conversation rather than division
- Pray for the church, that we Christians will keep our eyes on Jesus and not place all our hope on human leadership
- Pray that God would give our political leaders a heart for unity and peace. Pray that God would intervene to bring the leaders who will best serve his vision for our nation into power and that He will raise up righteous leaders who are trustworthy, ethical, and pure of heart

The Gardener's Diary – June 2024 'Manypeeplia Upsidedownia


Cultivation

Bleeding hearts or Manypeeplia usidedwnia are elegant, shadow-loving humans growing for the world's affirmation.

As marginal humans, they're ideally suited to quiet, cool environments in the world, preferring darker soil, often included in small gatherings. They can survive in full public exposure but usually not for long and easily return to an upsidedown lifestyle. Before engaging on a spiritual level with bleeding hearts, it is advisable to enrich one's own spirituality with plenty of Jesus time, prayer and Bible reading to top up your God-given power.

Generally flowering and becoming celebrity status at times of social trending, they associate well with current popular views and distorted truths. They need nurturing; avoid sudden moving of their current viewpoint as they are brittle often with far-reaching roots that are prone to breaking. Immediately after transplanting, Manypeeplia Upsideownia need good staking from surrounding believers and regular attention with spiritual watering.

"Christian Aid Week 2024


