We tried really hard to usher them back through the opening, we cajoled, waved and clapped, but because they couldn't see the other side, they were having non of it. Suddenly, one sheep decided to go for it and leapt high in the air over an imaginary gate, followed by the rest of the flock, returning to safe pastures. How many times dear friends, has the Lord led us in ways of darkness, where we fear to walk because we cannot see the way ahead? Jesus, the good shepherd asks us not to fear, but have faith in His guidance; for He will hold our hand in times of great need and carry us in His loving arms.

May God bless you all and could you remember to take a leap of faith – you will be amazed where the Lord will lead you. *Margaret*

TEACHING FOR NEW YEAR 2025

Now it is September and the new school year, let's look ahead to our worship in the autumn and beyond...

- From September until November, we shall continue through Matthew's Gospel.
- In December we shall take Advent themes: maybe some from the Old Testament prophecies, but I have not really planned that yet.
- From January we shall respond to the suggestion at a Church Meeting that we have services about 'What is Church'. This will be a series called 'Holy Habits', based on the activities of the early Church listed in Acts chapter 2 verses 42 to 47 and using material from Andrew Roberts' book *Holy Habits* (published by Malcolm Down, 2016). This identifies from the Biblical text ten Habits that should be part of our life as a Church, from 'Biblical Teaching' to 'Making More Disciples'. My hope is that at least some of our five Home Groups will tie in with this material, with discussion questions provided. (I realise that Home Groups tend to meet fortnightly, which does not fit with a weekly sermon series, but we shall sort something out!)

May all that we offer on Sunday mornings help and inspire all in our mixed congregation and may the total, and our responses, give glory to God, Who alone is worthy of our worship!

A Spoonful of Sugar..... or are you Sweet enough?

"Fairtrade is like a door to a great opportunity within our community", says Alfredo Ortega, Vice Chair of the Belize Sugar Cane Farmers Association. "Investmentis helping



the cane farmers produce a higher quantity and quality of sugar cane increasing the incomes of farmers. Through the Fairtrade premium we have been able to promote education, build schools, health centres, clinics and much more. For us, Fairtrade has been a new beginning."

But its not all sweetness and light for those not part of a Fairtrade Association. Sugar cane growing is a precarious occupation for most farmers because of difficult climate conditions and insufficient investment in cane replanting, fertilizers and pest and weed control. In recent years, farmers and communities have been hit by rising costs as well as by natural disasters. Unemployment levels have risen to around 9 per cent in the sugar growing areas of Belize and fewer children are now completing secondary education because their families are finding school fees, transport and meals unaffordable.

Look out for the Fairtrade logo when next you need to buy some sugar?

With the summer holiday period coming to an end our focus for this issue is for activities and events we have coming up. This includes encouragement to pray for our children and young people as they return to school, the Altogether service, prayers for the new Alpha course starting and a focus on Fairtrade Fortnight which is also happening in September.

With such a busy month there's lots to pray for and a lot to give thanks for as well! Don't forget there are lots of other ideas for prayer throughout Contact so please don't feel limited by what's included here!

We would love to encourage as many people as possible to contribute to the prayer sheet, so if you have any topics you would like to get people praying for then please get in touch with Rachel Edwards to get them included in future sheets.

Pray for the events planned in church celebrating Fairtrade Fortnight, that the people attending Tasters on Saturday will become more engaged with the Fairtrade concept. Pray that the staff from the Laundon Way Co-op (Adrian & Craig) will feel welcome and relevant (see page 11 for more info)

Pray for the Altogether Service on September 15th, that many families will come along, taking away a message of Christian love. Pray for Richard Knot who is leading the service, and all involved in planning, that they will know God's guidance.

Prayers for Alpha

Following the success of last year's Alpha course, we will once again be holding another course staring in September (details on pg 9). As with last year all the churches in Groby and Ratby will be coming together to put the course on for residents from both villages.

Alpha is a long-established course that introduces the participants to the beliefs of the Christian faith. Each evening comprises a meal together, watching a DVD and then discussion in small groups.

God has blessed it extensively in many countries of the World to bring innumerable people to know Christ.

Please pray:

• For all the guests who are attending our Alpha course, that every one will be open to listen to the views of others and recognise the truth of Christian claims.

• That every guest will be touched by God and draw closer to Him.

- For the Day Away in November.
- For the group facilitators, for sensitivity to allow discussions to flow and wisdom to know when to intervene.

• For the cooks from all four Churches who will make a major contribution by providing the dinners, at which relationships and friendships will be formed, facilitating later open discussions.

• For the four Churches and their clergy to continue to work together effectively for the Kingdom, to present a united Christian front in both villages.

• For the guests when the course has finished in late November, that they will find spiritual homes and continue on their journey of coming to know Christ.

Prayers for Schools

With September comes the end of the school holidays and the return to school for children and teachers. It also brings with it the



recommencement of most of our children's activities within Groby URC.

Let's spend some time this month praying for all the children and young people who are connected to our church in some way and those who work to support them both in church and at school.

Pray for:

- Those who are starting school for the first time or starting a new school.
- All those who may be nervous about going back to school

Let's also pray for all those who are teachers or who work within schools, ask that God will be with them as they go about their day-to-day work and that He will bless them in everything they do with the children in their care.

Fair Trade Fortnight - September 9th to 22nd.



Praying for Fair Trade allows us to bring trade issues before God, asking that God's love and justice will transform the rules and practices of trade. We pray that God will assist those suffering because of unfair trade ... those developing new ways of trading ... those making choices about what they sell or buy.

Pray that God will bless all who are involved with Fairtrade. Ask God to bless the producers in their endeavours as they grow their crops and craft their works. Ask God to grant them wisdom and discernment as they make decisions about how to use the benefits of Fairtrade.

Pray for those who are part of the Fairtrade chain of suppliers that enables us to buy Fairtrade items in our local shops. Pray for those within the industry that, in these days of huge competitive pricing, prioritise having goods to buy that are fairly traded and / or ethically sourced. Pray that this will be valued and not lost in the name of creating maximum profit for those who already have enough.

God has given us enough land to feed our populations, yet many go hungry. He has given us wealth, yet we are often slow to share. He has given us the ability to look outwards and to see where others need help, but often we only look at our own lives.

Ask God to touch our eyes afresh during Fairtrade Fortnight and enable us to see what you have created. Ask God to help us nurture and care for all that lives on this beautiful planet we call home, seeking His wisdom as we make our own choices. Pray that God will help us to always seek justice and fairness for places and people and to make this world a better place

On the 6th September last year five of us gathered to share some silence at Groby Library. Due to a bit of miscommunication we actually sat outside the library on the benches. Funnily enough silence doesn't need to be silent! It was a very warm day, cars were going past and people were around but that didn't matter. After a few words, conversation ceased for 20 minutes and we simply sat in silence.

Sitting in silence is a simple thing to do – something that you can easily do on your own. I imagine there are people who find this an easy thing to do: if there are, I am certainly not one of them! My mind can seem to become busier in the silence or, if I can relax, it can drift off towards sleep. In spite of this I know that I gain something from sitting in silence – that something may be intangible, difficult to identify but it is there. And science backs me up on that!

So, for the last year, a group of us has met on the first Monday of the month at 7:30 at Groby Community Library and shared silence for 20 minutes. And over the coming year we will do the same. The number of people has varied from 3 to 9: not always the same people. And this is to remind you that you are always welcome to join us. Whether this becomes a new routine, or you just want to try it once.

Julian Meetings have their roots in the Christian faith, but everyone is welcome, whatever your faith or belief. If you would appreciate sharing some silence you will find us at the library at 7:30pm on the first Monday of each month (even Bank Holidays!!).

The calendar tells us that it is now high summer, even if the weather does not appear so sure! Yet it was warm and sunny on the June Saturday afternoon when we gathered from all five Churches at Christ Church and concluded with worship in their garden.

So, what are the Churches up to this summer?

Braunstone is planning a 'Café Church' for their July afternoon service, in response to the wide age range of its regular congregation, nearly all of whom have regular roles in its services. We extend our condolences to its Secretary, Sheena Davis, on the death of her father in May.

Following up its successful monthly Messy Church, **Christ Church** will be holding a children's Holiday Club on the mornings of 13th to 15th August. The Church recently rejoiced with regular attendees John and Tammy Hearn at the blessing of their marriage.

Enderby has a series of money-raising events on the last Saturdays of each summer month, with a Craft Fair on 27th July and then an antique and collectors' fair on 31st August. Meanwhile Enderby is starting the process of becoming recognised as a Child & Youth Friendly Church.

Groby will be inviting those on 'the fringe' of the Church, or who attend the Saturday 'Tasters' café, to worship and lunch on August 25th and to a barbeque after an 'all together' service on September 15th. Those will be followed by another ecumenical *Alpha* course in the autumn.

I should particularly seek your prayers for our friends at **St Stephen's**. It is becoming almost impossible to meet the financial demands of keeping up its dearly loved Victorian building from a slowly dwindling congregation. It has therefore been decided that the time has come seriously to consider the long-term future for St Stephen's URC and an Elders' Meeting with the Synod Moderator is scheduled for late August. I should emphasise that nothing has been decided yet, but even this initial exploration feels a sad step.

Nevertheless, St Stephen's will definitely be hosting our next Resource Area event, as we mark the 350th anniversary of the birth of the great Congregational hymn writer, Isaac Watts, with a 'Songs of Praise' at 6.30 pm on Saturday 5th October. Doubtless we shall sing his greatest hymns, like 'Our God, our help in ages past' and 'When I survey the wondrous cross'. Please join us; we are opening this event up to other local Churches too.

Looking further ahead, we shall repeat our successful 'Christmas Capers' from last year, on Saturday 14th December at 4.00 pm (venue to be advised), so please add the date to your diary and consider what you might contribute to the afternoon!

So, while we recognise some sadness and frustration within local Church life, there is clearly very much for which to thank our God, both in the past and in the future with Him.
