

Welcome to the November edition of Contact.

November is a month of remembering. Our memories can stir so many emotions in us. They can be a source of thankfulness, of smiles and laughter, and of tears. Recommended Reads (or listen if you prefer.)



Lectio 365 is a free daily devotional resource to help people to pray the Bible every day. It is written by the 24-7 Prayer movement leaders (Pete Greig and others) and is delivered through an app. The app can be downloaded to phones or tablets (but not desktop computers) and is very easy to use.

Lectio 365 is inspired by an ancient form of praying the Bible called Lectio Divina (divine reading). It is a way of approaching Scripture expectant that we will encounter God and hear something relevant for our lives today.

Morning Prayers are short devotionals written for every day of the year. On Sundays a simple Sabbath Prayer is found and on special Saint's days the focus is on celebrating heroes of the faith.

Night Prayers aim to help readers process their day with God and prepare to sleep by reflecting, rejoicing, repenting and resting.

You can listen or read which ever works best for you. Music is used but can be turned off if you find that unhelpful.

The stated aim of the writers is that these devotionals will help you meet with Jesus today and every day. I've been using the app for a few months, and like a number of others in Church I have found it to be helpful. If you've not seen it why not take a look?

WHAT IS GROBY URC'S **CONNECTION WITH JUSTINA?**



Justina aged 24 lives in Kagoro Zambia – one of the least developed countries in Africa, with 54% of the population living on less than £1.50 a day. Her family have always struggled to escape poverty. Despite primary education being free in Zambia, low income families can't afford books, uniforms, shoes, and healthcare too is expensive.

SO WHAT IS OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH JUSTINA?



Through their partners, the church community in Kangoro help break the cycle through a Transforming Communities programme, which equips the church in practical ways to work with the local community.

Justina undertook training in tailoring skills and now has a sewing machine to make and mend clothes. She sews school uniforms, and profits from her business are funding her niece's education. Justina has further plans to become a qualified teacher and she's saving money to pay for the training.

Prayers for the Alpha Awayday

As you will be aware the churches in Groby and Ratby have once again joined together to run an Alpha course for anyone who may be interested in exploring more about Christianity.

A key part of the course is the Alpha Away Day, which focuses on the Holy Spirit. This year's away day is to be held on Saturday 9th November at St Joseph's Tea Rooms.

Let's pray:

- That all those who are on the course will be able to attend the awayday.
- For all those attending the day that they will experience the Holy Spirit for themselves and will forward in their journey to knowing Jesus.
- For those who are leading the session, that they will be

- filled with the Holy Spirit and that God will give them the right words.
- For those who are facilitating the discussions, that God will bless them with insight on how to lead conversations and how to encourage the members of their group to think about this more deeply.

As the Alpha course moves towards its final sessions let us pray for all those who have taken part in the course this year and remember those who took part last year, that completing Alpha will be the first step on their journey of faith and that they will continue on this journey.

Let's also pray for ourselves as churches, that God will show us how we can continue to support those who have completed Alpha on their journey and how we can encourage them to become a part of church communities so that they can learn more about Jesus and how they can have a relationship with Him.

Prayers of Thankfulness for the young people's away weekend.

After reading Louise's report on the weekend away in Bromsgrove (see page 14), give thanks to God for the 9 teenagers who took part, and for Louise and volunteers that accompanied and supported them over the weekend. Ask God to bless each of these teenagers, that He will continue speaking to them through activities in church and beyond. Pray that they will know God's love in their lives.

Prayers for Journey to Bethlehem

Journey to Bethlehem is an annual event where members from both Groby churches come together to share the message of Christmas with children from across the village.

This year Journey to Bethlehem will be held at the URC from Monday 2nd December to Wednesday 4th. All three Groby Primary Schools will be attending and will experience the true meaning of Christmas re-enacted. This is a great opportunity for children throughout Groby to hear the story of Christmas and to welcome them into our church.

Whilst it may seem early to be thinking about Christmas preparations for this production are already underway so let's pray for:

- All those who are involved in the production, planning and preparation of the sessions as work gets underway to make sure everything is ready.
- The children and staff from all three schools who will be attending, that they will understand the important message of what Christmas is really about and that they will take this to heart in build up to Christmas.
- That God will protect and bless all those involved in Journey to Bethlehem, both those running it and those watching it, as they share in His word at the start of this busy time.

Saturday afternoon continued with sessions looking at how story affects our lives and how to deal with the bad stuff in life.


